“Blue Thumb – Planting for Clean Water Workshops”

An introduction to creating beautiful gardens that help keep water clean

Everyone is catching on! Creating landscaped areas with native plants or gardens that soak up rainwater is the secret to leisurely living in great looking yards. Attend a Blue Thumb workshop to see how others in your city have created great looking landscaped areas that benefit local lakes, rivers, and wetlands.
